During this program, we will work both inside and outside. There are a few things you should bring with you to assure that you have what you need to make your time in my class more pleasant. Here are suggested supplies:

- A water bottle for drinking
- A sun hat or visor (for painting outdoors) and sunblock
- Insect repellent
- Hand-wipes (for hands and quick clean ups)
- Smock or clothes that can get dirty; comfortable clothes for yoga and painting.

Art Supplies

- A small set of watercolors. STAPLES carries a brand called **Prang**, a set that contains little pans of color. This is a good and inexpensive choice, or bring any watercolors you may have.
- A watercolor brush (number 12, 14, or 16). Bring any brushes you may have.
- A set of **oil pastels** (sometimes known as **CRAY-PAS**.) **Michael's** arts and crafts store has a good selection of brands; the Michael's brand is very inexpensive.
- A small set of soft pastels. These are different from oil pastels as they are chalky and "come off" if you touch them. (hand wipes really help to keep fingers clean). Buy a set that has at least 24 colors. Some suggested brands are *Rembrandt*, *Unison*, *Holbein* and *Sennelier*. Less expensive brands are okay since you will be learning to use them and needn't invest a lot of money.
- A board that you can put your paper on: cardboard, foam core, (it should be light weight yet sturdy). Masonite is too heavy and has sharp corners. The size should be approximately 11x14 inches or 16x20 inches.
- A roll of masking tape
- A container with a top for water (yogurt or similar).
- A couple of regular pencils.
- Hand-wipes, rags, a roll of paper towels are all handy things to have.

Note Bring any supplies you have and would like to try. **Nothing is off limits.** This class is about experimentation! I will bring extra art supplies; if there are items you can't bring, you can borrow or buy supplies in class.

I recommend the following websites to purchase art supplies at a discount. Michaels and Jo-Anne's are good <u>retail stores.</u> On line sites are: DickBlick.com, CheapJoes.com, DanielSmith.com, and Jerry's art-a-Rama.com, You can "google" discount art supply stores and find your own.
